SCRIPTURE

JESUS & NICODEMUS

There was a man from the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Him at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that You have come from God as a teacher, for no one could perform these signs You do unless God were with him." Jesus replied, "I assure you: Unless someone is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." "But how can anyone be born when he is old?"

" Nicodemus asked Him. "Can he enter his mother's womb a second time and be born? " Jesus answered, "I assure you: Unless someone is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. Whatever is born of the flesh is flesh, and whatever is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be amazed that I told you that you must be born again. The wind blows where it pleases, and you hear its sound, but you don't know where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." "How can these things be? " asked Nicodemus. "Are you a teacher of Israel and don't know these things? " Jesus replied. "I assure you: We speak what We know and We testify to what We have seen, but you do not accept Our testimony. If I have told you about things that happen on earth and you don't believe, how will you believe if I tell you about things of heaven? No one has ascended into heaven except the One who descended from heaven — the Son of Man. Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in Him will have eternal life. "For God loved the world in this way: He gave His One and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world that He might condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. Anyone who believes in Him is not condemned,

but anyone who does not believe is already condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the One and Only Son of God. "This, then, is the judgment: The light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil. For everyone who practices wicked things hates the light and avoids it, so that his deeds may not be exposed. But anyone who lives by the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be shown to be accomplished by God."

THE CALL TO BE A SERVANT OF GOD

Rev. Fred Boyer ("Theo"), son of the late James and Annie Baker Boyer, was born in Marianna, Florida, Jackson County, on January 30, 1923, and departed this life on Tuesday, March 9, 2021.

Fred completed his high school equivalency with the GED program, General Education Development /Diploma. He attended and graduated from Crozer Theological Seminary and Manna Bible Institute.

He was employed at The Boeing Company for eight years and as a crane operator at Scott Paper Company for 40 plus years.

Fred married his bride, Dorothy Louise Tankard. They celebrated 49 years of marriage on October 31, 2003.

He had four daughters, Dorothy, Catherine (Cathie), Rose (Rosie), and Janice ("Jay-Jay"). Fred was instrumental in providing a wonderful home for his family, using his carpentry skills in building his place of residence.

Fred accepted the call to the ministry at a young age and, over the years, became the Founder and Senior Pastor at Friendship Baptist Church, Chester, Pa. As a result of family life changes, Fred joined Temple Baptist Church, located in Chester, PA, and became one of the Associate Ministers. Being active in the Chichester community, Fred transferred his membership to Mount Pleasant Baptist Church, where he became a ministerial team member. As time allowed, Fred participated in the Outreach Ministry. He had a particular interest daily in Christian Television Network, which enhanced his spiritual development while bound at home.

In July 2008, Fred accepted the invitation to visit the country Ghana, which is in West Africa. While there, he extended his missionary gifts in the villages and had the opportunity to preach three times and lead Worship Services. Also, while in Ghana, Fred was able to visit Kakum National Park, located in the Central Region of Ghana's coastal environs. It is known for "The Canopy Walk," a bridge that extends for more than 300 meters and includes a viewing platform and seven bridges up to 35 meters above the forest floor. Fred had the opportunity to walk the entire bridge constructed with wire rope, aluminum, and wooden planks, and safety netting.


